Keywords

Colour – Vibrant, Monochrome, Sepia, Vivid , exposed

Composition – arrangement, balance unbalanced, cropped, macro, focal point, depth of field.

Technique – Layered, merged, mixed media, digital, shutter speed, exposure.

Mood – Calm, sombre, expressive, energetic
